A: The Eternal Security of the Believer

- 1. The Realities to be understood:
 - a. Salvation: Our need and its nature: 1 Corinthians 1.18
 - b. Regeneration: A new life within: Colossians 2.13
 - c. Justification: A new position before God: Romans 5.1, 9
- 2. The Relationships into which we have been brought:
 - a. The Family of God: we have been adopted: Galatians 4.5
 - b. The Bride of Christ: we have been espoused: 2 Corinthians 11.2
 - c. The Body of Christ: we are members: Romans 12.4-5

 - a. Adam, Romans 5.12-18: Guilt before God is immense.
 - b. Christ, Romans 5.12-18: The gift of grace is irrevocable.

 - a. Grace is the basis of our salvation, excluding works: Romans 4.4, Ephesians 2.8
 - b. Grace is not a license to continue in sin: Romans 6.1, 14

B: The Assurance of Salvation

 - a. Mistakes regarding the doctrine of salvation and security:
 - "Bad doctrine leads to bewildering doubts."
 - i. The completeness of forgiveness: Colossians 2.13
 All our sins were future when Christ died.
 - ii. The consummated work of Christ: John 19.30
 - iii. The confidence in self: Galatians 3.3
 - b. Misunderstood texts:
 - i. Warning passages in Hebrews, such as 6.4-8
 - ii. Persevering passages in Matthew 10.22, 24.14, Mark 13.13
 - iii. "If" passages, such as Colossians 1.21-23
 - c. Misdeeds:
 - i. How many sins are enough to make one lose his salvation?
 - ii. Which sins are serious enough to make one lose his salvation?

 - a. The Judge: John 5.24
 - b. The Father: Luke 15.20
